Description of Course

The purpose of any language is to communicate. With that in mind, lessons are structured to provide students with multiple opportunities to actively use the language in meaningful and authentic situations.

In French 5 students will continue to develop and expand language skills previously learned. They can expect to be able to perform more complex communication tasks in all four language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. These will include such things as extended and Creative Conversation, past and future narration in all tenses with the use of complex sentences, in depth discussion of other places, people, and events, respond to various stimuli and deal with the unexpected. By necessity, students must strive to communicate solely in French at all times (not doing so will affect their participation grade).
